Building Inspections Department

Activity Report for March 2012

The Building Inspections Department report includes activity for building permitting, plan reviews, building inspections, demolitions, planning & zoning, code enforcement and the animal control officer's activities.

Building Permits –

54 building permits were issued and fees collected in March.

Total fees collected for building permits was \$5,977.05.

Plan Reviews –

There was a Plan Review for a single family dwelling for Jamie Carstens.

Building Inspections –

We had two inspections for Minimum Housing Inspections in March for Beatrice Housing Authority.

Demolitions of Dilapidated Structures –

City had one demolition this month at 1005 N 7th.

Planning & Zoning –

The Planning and Zoning Board met in March for Prelim/Final Plat for Ron Bird and also for Duane Evans. There was a re-zoning for Ron Bird. The second meeting of P & Z was for a Special Use for Stacy Lenners for a larger building and also a Special Use for Eugene Wolken for a larger building.

Code Enforcement –

The Code Enforcement Officer reviewed 49 code violations in March. Thirty-eight of these violations are currently being investigated and 9 have been corrected and two were sent to the attorney.

Animal Control –

Animal Control received 98 calls in March.

The Animal Control Officer is continually fielding calls, giving advice and answering questions from citizens on a daily basis in regards to eliminating vermin and rodents from properties.

Beatrice Fire & Rescue
Monthly Report
March 2012

Beatrice Fire and Rescue responded to 206 emergency medical calls and 28 fire and or hazardous material calls in March 2012. In March 2011, we responded to 204 emergency medical calls and 22 fire and or hazardous material calls. Friday was the busiest day of the week with 44 EMS calls.

Our top three patient transport locations were 113 patients to Beatrice Community Hospital & Health Center, 22 patients to Bryan/LGH East and 16 patients to St. Elizabeth.

Of our 206 medical calls this March, 140 of them were ALS calls, this accounted for 67.96% of our medical calls. A total of 31 were BLS calls, at 15.05% and the last 16.99% of our medical calls fall into the other category. Items that fall into this category are the no transports, no patient found, called off, etc.

In March we conducted a total of 5 speaking engagements regarding community education covering fire prevention and injury prevention.

Training topics for March included: Fire Officer 1, resource management, hose line deployment, aerial platform operations, strategy and tactics, Wildland and ground fires, fire behavior, survival techniques in fire, ground ladders, station safety, automobile extrication, and ambulance driving and operation. We also hosted the week long NIMS 300/400 that a number of our employees attended.

Dr. Rice was down on March 29th and presented a very interesting and interactive program on pain management. We, like everyone else in healthcare, have begun to have difficulties in obtaining certain medications. There are a number of reasons why these shortages are occurring. We are working with Dr. Rice in addressing this issue at the State level to expand the model protocols. We are also looking at alternative medications that are available and are not part of the model protocols, which means we have write a new protocol with Dr. Rice to get approval to use these medications. Once these changes are closer to being in place I will notify our emergency room of what is going to happen.

We also had our annual function test done on the regulators of our self contained breathing apparatus. We did have two of the regulators that did require repairs. We also began the required hydro-stat testing of our breathing air cylinders. This has to be done once every three years. March also began the process of our annual testing of the fire hose.

It looks like Justin Theasmeyer will be able to test for his paramedic license in July.

Scott Street Ball fields –

- The improvements for field 5 have been completed. Fields 1 and 2 will begin sprinkler installation this week.
- Electric Department has completed the lighting project for field 5.
- Bullets have six tournaments scheduled for the upcoming baseball season.

Beatrice Police Department –

- The front doors will have automatic door openers installed to improve handicap accessibility. Installation date is 6 weeks out.

City Auditorium –

- City staff is continuing the installation of the Lighting project. 138 of 178 fixtures have been installed. The fixtures were installed in the Fire Department Offices and Dorm Area, the Housing Authority and Main Street Offices, ½ of the Gym and 1/3 of the Fire Department bay area. Electrical panels will be installed next week.
- Quotes for concrete improvements to the Fire Department parking lot were received on April 6th. Brian Hill Construction had the lowest bid and has been chosen for the project.

Miscellaneous Items –

- Front women's bathroom at Chautauqua Park was vandalized and is temporarily closed for repairs. This occurrence is the 4th time the bathroom has been vandalized in the last 6-9 months. The bathroom should be re-opened next week.
- Staff spent time last week shoring up the abutments on the bridges along the Homestead Trail.

Monthly Report

Through April 9, 2012

Administration

Financial – Electric energy sales for March 2012 were about 10.54% lower than March 2011 due to milder weather conditions. Revenues were 2.2% lower in February 2012 due to the lower energy sales. Water sales for March 2012 were 11.72% lower than March 2011 primarily due to lower sales to Koch Nitrogen who decreased their consumption by 7,925,000 gallons over March 2011. Revenues increased about .60% due to increase in rates. WPC sales for March 2012 were 6.35% lower than March 2011. Revenues were 5.95% higher due to the increase in rates.

Administrative Operations continue at a normal pace with little to no change in the day to day operations.

Operations Activities

Water Department – The department has continued to change out water meters when time allows, as well as exercising water valves and testing backflow devices. We have completed the water meter change outs for $\frac{3}{4}$ inch and smaller, and we are waiting for more 1 inch meters to arrive so they can be changed out also.

Several days were spent on the removal of concrete at the Service Center parking lot, so it could be replaced. The erosion of the joints was getting to the point of safety concerns for our employees falling or tripping.

We had to replace a couple of service lines that were leaking and also installed three meter pits to move the meters to the outside of the homes or business.

There was a water main break at 8th & Oak Street. This break was under the box culvert and we decided to cap this water main because of the situation. Since it is a 4 inch water main, it is recommended that it be upsized according to the water system analysis. Because of this break, this water main replacement should be moved up to be done in the next couple of years.

We also helped the Street Department on several areas that they replaced concrete with our backhoe and breaker.

Electric Department – The following projects were worked on this past month:

Distribution Work

A three phase overhead line was rebuilt to supply a new pivot system. Two distribution poles were replaced due to the condition of the poles. Twelve days were spent on tree trimming and removal. The lighting poles and circuits were installed at the West Scott Street ball diamond.

New primary and secondary circuits were installed at the Carnegie building along with a new pad mount transformer. A new pad mount transformer was installed for a new building at Hasenkamp fertilizer.

Substation/Transmission Work

At Substation #5 the voltage tap changer gear box had to be rebuilt and the motor replaced. Annual testing was performed at several substations in preparation for the coming summer months.

Services

Three overhead services were replaced because of poor insulation. One overhead service was replaced for an upgrade. A three phase service to the Travelers Lodge hotel was rebuilt for a remodel.

Street Lighting

We received reports on 28 street lights and security lights which were not working. They have all been repaired. Three street light poles were relocated for upcoming road construction.

WPC Department – No report submitted.

Street Department – The following projects were worked on this past month:

- We have been doing some patching.
- We are trimming and cutting trees. We removed nine (9) trees this month.
- We are grading and reshaping some of our gravel roads.
- Concrete repair at 1019 North 6th Street. The storm sewer was caving in, and we removed the catch basin and part of the culvert.
- Concrete repair at 6th and Logan Street.
- Concrete repairs on North 6th between Jefferson Street and Summit Street.
- Concrete repair to the Service Center parking lot.
- We are crack sealing the new concrete at the Service Center.
- We have been sweeping the streets.
- We have been taking down our snow fence.
